Day 1: Sunday 14th September, 2025.

Northern Region:

There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms with moderate rains over parts of Kebbi, Sokoto, Zamfara, Kaduna, Kano, Katsina Adamawa and Taraba states during the morning hours. In the afternoon/evening hours, isolated thunderstorms with moderate rains are expected over parts of Bauchi, Gombe, Adamawa, Taraba, Kaduna Borno and Katsina states.

Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with sunshine Intervals is expected over this region during the morning hours with chances of moderate rains over Niger, Kogi and Benue states. Later in the day, Isolated thunderstorms with moderate rains are expected over most parts of the region.

Southern Region:

Cloudy skies are anticipated over the region with chances of moderate rains over parts of Abia, Ebonyi, Delta, Akwa Ibom and Cross River states during the morning hours. In the afternoon/evening periods, moderate rains are anticipated over most parts of the region.

Day 2: Monday 15th September, 2025.

Northern Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is expected over the region with prospects of Isolated thunderstorms with moderate rains over Taraba, Adamawa, Borno, Bauchi, Gombe, Kaduna and Yobe states during the morning period. Later in the afternoon/evening period, isolated thunderstorms with moderate rains are expected over most parts of the region.

There are prospects of Flooding over parts of Adamawa, Taraba and Kaduna states.

Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is expected over the region with chances of moderate rain over parts of Kogi, Niger, the Federal Capital Territory, Kwara and Benue states during the morning hours. In the afternoon/evening hours, thunderstorm with moderate rain is anticipated over most parts of the region.

There are prospects of Flooding over parts of the Federal Capital Territory, Nasarawa, Niger, Kogi and Kwara states.

Southern Region:

Cloudy skies are anticipated over the region with chances of moderate rains over parts of Oyo, Cross River and Akwa Ibom states during the morning hours. Later during the afternoon/evening period, light to moderate rain is expected over most parts of the region.

Day 3: Tuesday 16th September, 2025.

Northern Region:

Cloudy skies with intervals of sunshine are expected over this region with chances of isolated thunderstorm with light rains over parts of Taraba, Sokoto, Zamfara, Adamawa, Kano and Kaduna states during the morning period. During the afternoon/evening period, isolated thunderstorms with moderate rains are expected over most parts of the region.

Central Region:

Cloudy skies with intervals of sunshine are expected over this region with prospects of thunderstorm with moderate rain over parts of the Federal Capital Territory, Plateau, Kogi, Kwara Nasarawa and Benue states during the morning hours. Later in the afternoon/evening hours, there are prospects of isolated thunderstorms with moderate rains over most parts of the region.

There are prospects of Flooding over parts of Benue, Kogi and Plateau states.

Southern Region:

Cloudy skies are anticipated over the region with prospects of moderate rains over parts of Oyo, Ogun, Ondo, Edo, Delta, Rivers, Bayelsa, Cross River and Akwa Ibom states during the morning hours. In the afternoon/evening periods, moderate rains are anticipated over most parts of the region.

There are prospects of Flooding over parts Edo, Ondo and Ekiti states.

Advisory

- i. Driving under heavy rain should be avoided.
- ii. To avoid leaching of nutrients, farmers should refrain from applying fertilizer and pesticides right before the rains.
- iii. Ensure that loose objects are fastened to avoid collision.
- iv. Disconnect electrical appliances from electrical sockets.
- v. Stay away from tall trees to avoid impact from falling branches and broken trees.
- vi. Airline operators are advised to get airport-specific weather reports (flight documentation) from NiMet for effective planning in their operations.
